

CCRA TENNIS RULES AND REGULATIONS

RESERVATIONS

Members may reserve court time through the online reservation system on the CCRA website, up to three days prior to play. Reservations begin on the hour and are void if court is not claimed within 15 minutes after the scheduled start time. If unable to use a reservation, please cancel so others may use the time.

The tennis pro may reserve courts in advance for lessons, clinics and tennis programs, as approved by the Board. Mixers, leagues, social events, lessons and other activities have court priority, and courts will be reserved in advance. Check the CCRA online reservation system for updates on court availability during these events; the CCRA website and notices posted at the courts also provide information on tennis programs.

GUEST FEES

All members should pay guest fees (\$8) for each guest player. Guest cards may be pre-purchased from the pool desk, or members may prepay \$25 to \$100 or more to cover guest fees for a season when playing annual dues. A working honor system for guest fees helps support court improvements.

USPTA PROFESSIONAL

USPTA Pro, Betsy Heidenberger and her staff offer private and group lessons for children and adults. For more information, check her website (www.Bheidenberger.usptapro.com) or inquire at Betsyrocket@verizon.net. Outside teaching pros are not allowed to give lessons at any time.

GATE LOCK

Members should use the key card provided to member families to open the electronic gate lock. To exit the courts, wave your hand over the designated switch to the right on the gate. It is important to make sure the court door is locked when you leave.

FAMILIES WITH LIMITED RIGHTS

Families with Combination and Partial Summer rights may reserve tennis courts from late July to season closing and may use vacant, unreserved tennis courts before then on weekdays. Weekday members may use empty courts on weekdays only.

COURT DECORUM

Members and guests are expected to use the courts in a courteous, sporting manner. Please enter and leave court enclosure without disturbing or interrupting play on an adjacent court.

- Players must wear rubber-soled non-marking tennis shoes. No running shoes; no sandals. Shirts should be worn at all times.
- Both courts have divider curtains, which may be used with agreement of all tennis players involved.
- Please, no pets, private ball machines, skateboards, bikes, strollers, or any wheels on the courts at any time.

TENNIS LIGHTS

For longer life, the halogen court lights should not be turned off once they have been turned on for the evening unless you appear to be the last players. Please check instructions on the light panel for use. If you are the last players using the courts for the evening, please turn the light switches to 0 (OFF) so the lights will not burn needlessly and waste energy.

TENNIS TRASH

Out of consideration for other members, please deposit all trash (i.e. tennis cans, lids, water bottles, etc.) in appropriate trash receptacles located in and around the tennis courts. When the pool is closed for the season (mid-September to Memorial Day) there is no trash pickup and players should take all trash home. Court trash receptacles should never be used to dispose food, used diapers or other garbage. No glass or food is allowed on the courts.

Everyone is responsible for helping to keep the courts and surrounding areas clean.

COMPLIANCE

The CCRA Board hopes that members will abide by the tennis rules. Failure to comply with a rule could be an abuse subject to withdrawal of reservation privileges and other penalties. The Board Members, General Manager, Tennis Director and Pool Manager will oversee compliance with the rules or mediate any disputes. Penalties for violations will be imposed by the Tennis Chairperson and be subject to review by the Board.
